## What You Need to Know

- All embassies are open from **10 am to 4 pm**, unless otherwise noted.
- **Admission is free.** Reservations are not required.
- Complimentary **shuttle bus service** travels three separate loops from 10 am to 4 pm. All routes begin and end at Dupont Circle, between Massachusetts Ave. and P St., NW. See map for details.
- The complimentary shuttle service **ends at 4 pm** and most embassies are open until 4 pm. Please plan accordingly and/or take alternative transportation back to your point of origin. See labeled Metrobus routes at the bottom of the map.
- Street parking is available but difficult at many embassy locations.
- Because many embassies are within walking distance of the Dupont Circle and Van Ness Metro stations, please consider using public transportation rather than the shuttle (the lines can often become long).
- Many embassies require photo ID for admission.
- Embassies on International Drive are larger and often have shorter lines than those on Embassy Row.
